Dear Ms. McDougall,

I am writing to you as President of the Nova Scotia Federation of Municipalities to voice my concerns regarding the Nova Scotia Non-Resident Property Tax proposed by the province. I realize this is a provincial issue and I have expressed my concerns to the Premier, local MLAs and the Nova Scotia Law Amendments Committee as outlined in the attached letter.

However, there is a larger potential issue to your municipalities that should be concerning to your board and members. As outlined in an email (copy attached) I sent to the Mayor of Colchester County, Ms. Christine Blair on the potential financial impact to local business in her municipality Mine is just a very small example of the potential risks that your board and members are facing and should be highlighted in your conversations with your provincial partner, The Department of Municipal Affairs.

There are 27,000 non-resident landowners in the province with a large majority of them who live in rural areas and who are evaluating projects and making decisions that may impact your local municipalities because of this unjustified and discriminatory tax.
