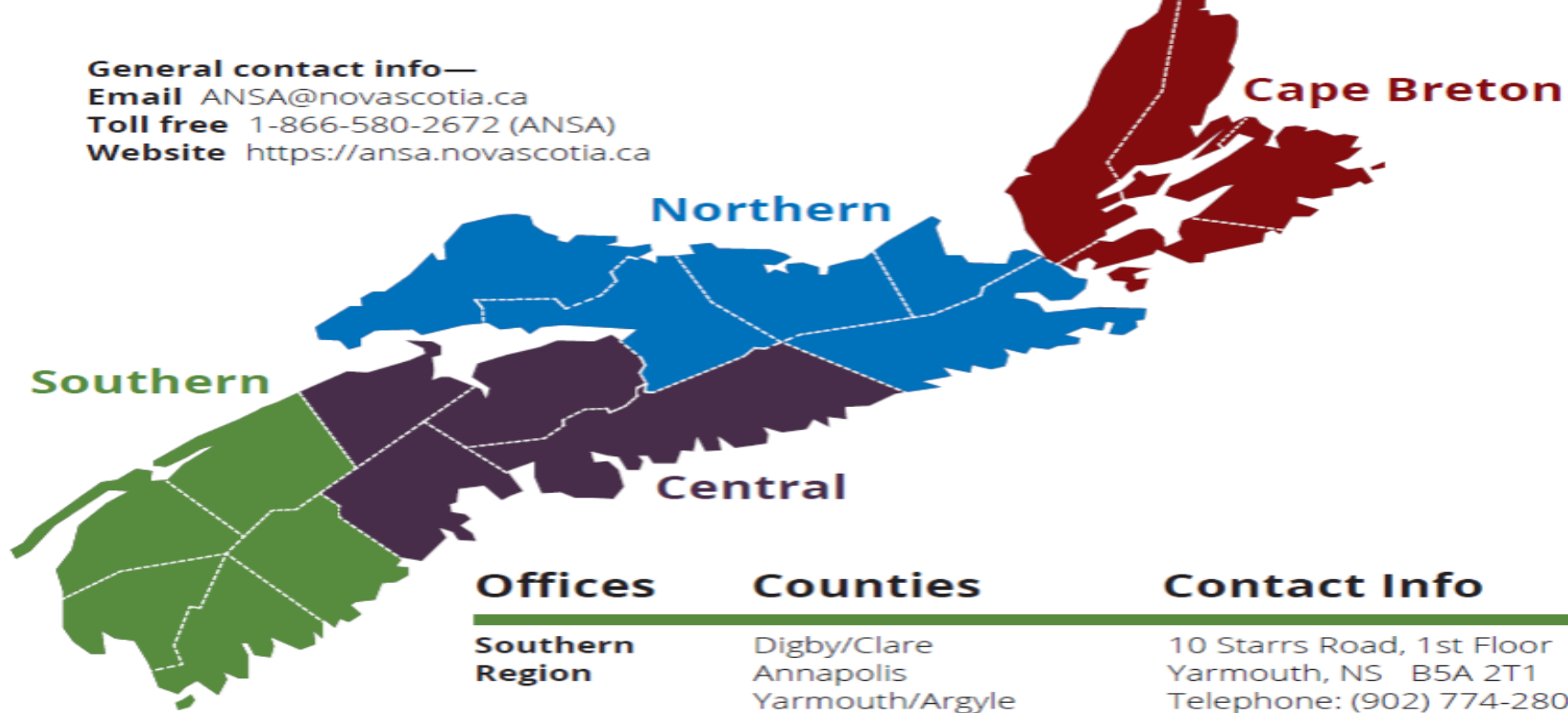

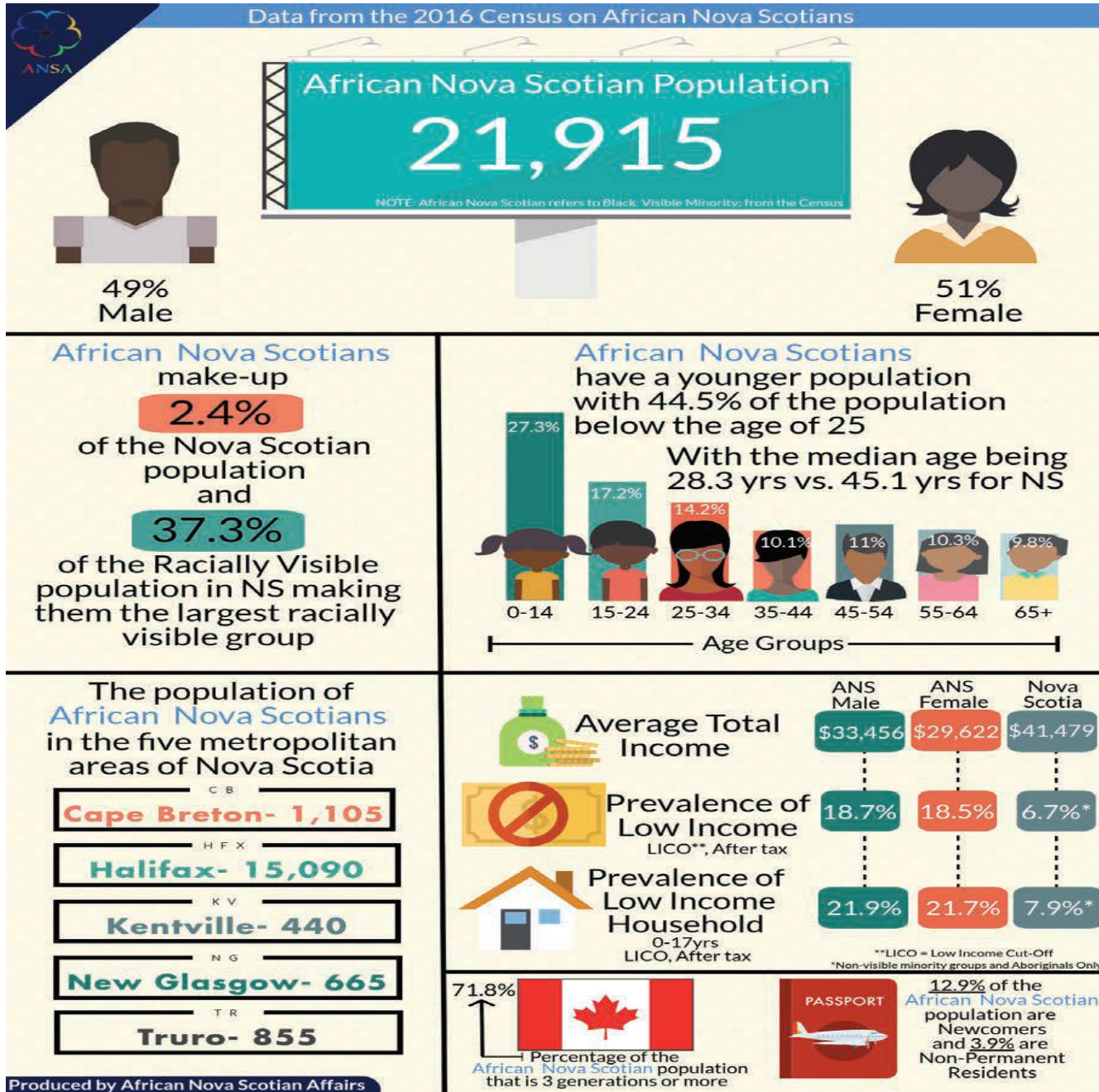

- Low levels of Employment, Systemic & Environmental Racism



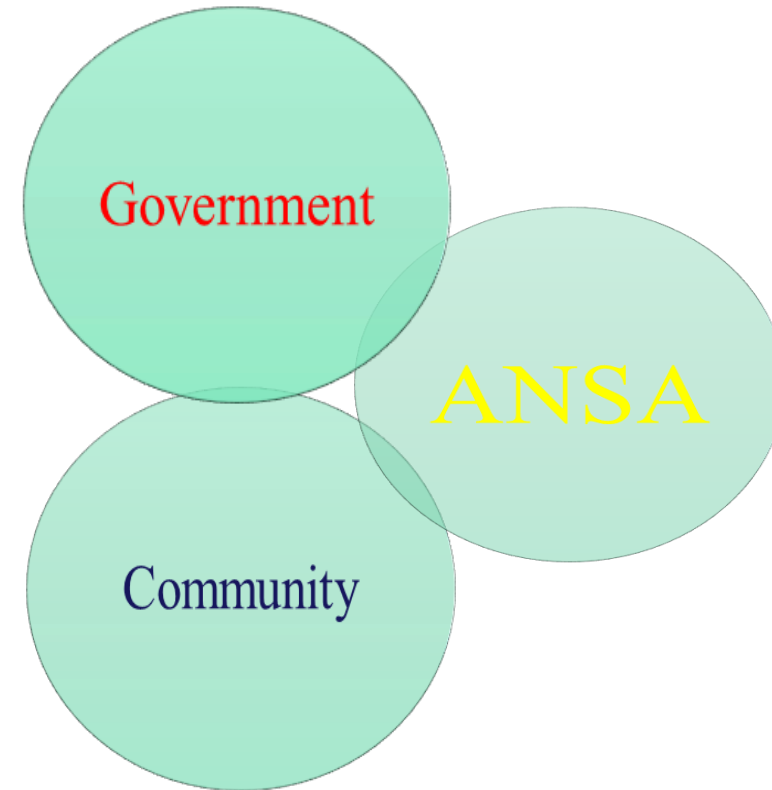


# Our Role is Critical

By drawing attention to the priorities that matter with community collaboration.

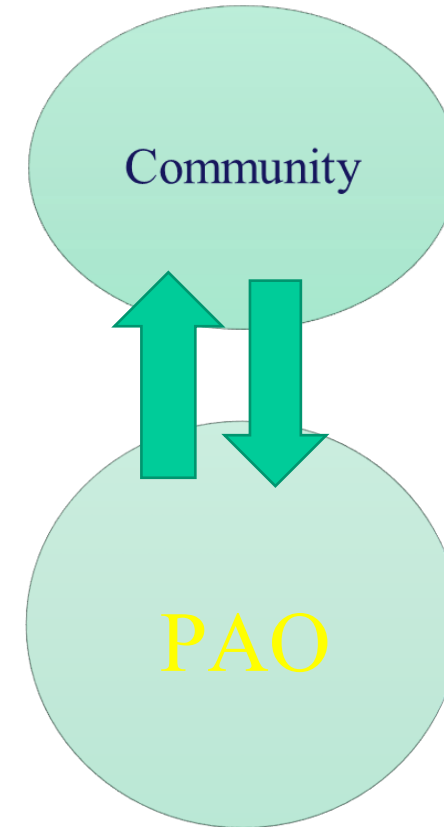




## As a **PAO** our Key Contribution to the Community would be

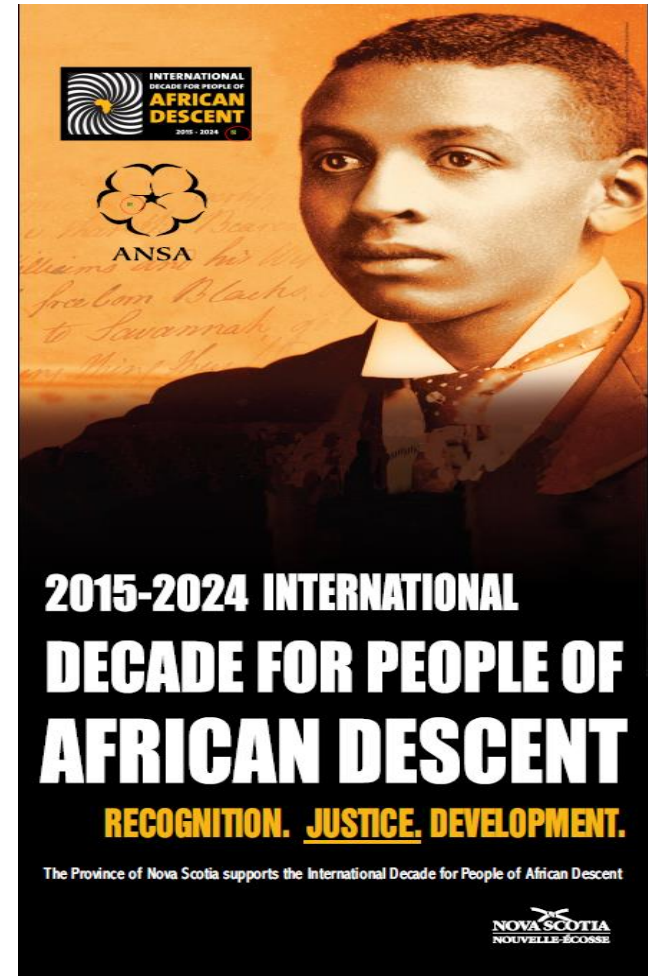

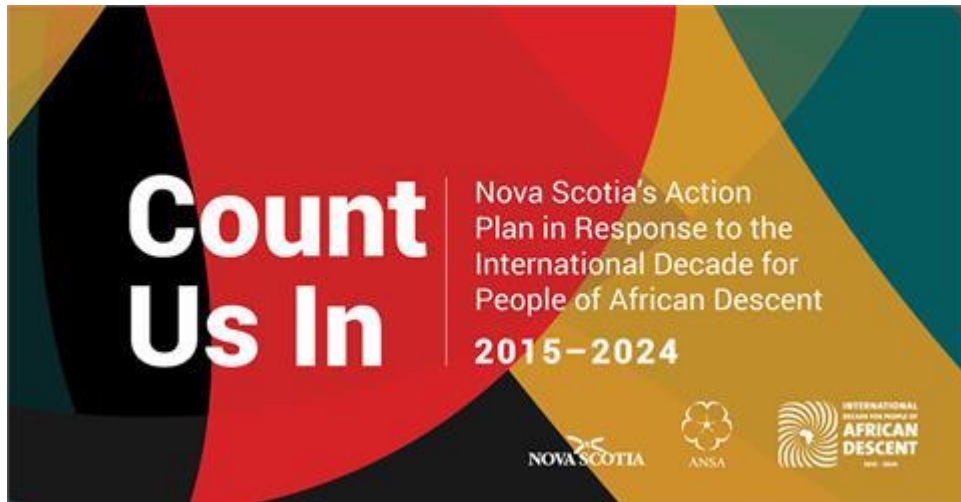
