Canada Community Building Fund

NSFM works with the Department of Municipal Affairs and Housing to help administer the Canada Community-Building Fund. We provide support and collaborate with the Province to help municipalities meet program requirements.

The aim of this work positions municipalities to take full advantage of this federal program as a means to make their communities more sustainable, prosperous and vibrant.

NSFM contributes to the Department of Municipal Affairs and Housing Infrastructure Spotlight Report to provide an overview of projects undertaken by Nova Scotia municipalities with support from the Canada Community Building Fund.

The report aims to demonstrate how municipalities are using this federal funding to benefit their communities. It also highlights best practices and innovation, providing a range of local municipal initiatives that support the national objectives of the CCBF.

Sustainable Communities Challenge Fund

The Sustainable Communities Challenge Fund is a provincial grant program for local action on climate change in Nova Scotia. It supports community efforts to reduce or remove greenhouse gas emissions, or to prepare for and respond to the impacts of a changing climate. A wide range of projects are eligible for funding, from renewable energy, to public outreach initiatives, to coastal restoration. The goal is to help communities implement the climate action they have decided is important to them.
